#### **Snake Cleaning and Care-SOP**

## **Objective:**

To ensure appropriate cleaning and disinfecting of enclosures in order to prevent the spread of illness and to maintain health of the pet.

#### **Procedure**

# **Daily Spot Cleaning:**

- 1. Remove any skin sheds, urates, and uneaten food
- 2. Remove any soiled substrate and replace with new substrate
  - a. Appropriate substrates are repti-bark, newspaper, or coconut fiber
- 3. Wipe down any soiled areas in the enclosure using Dawn soap and water solution
  - a. This includes any foliage and furniture in the enclosure
- 4. Remove food and water dishes
  - a. Clean dishes with Dawn soap and water
  - b. Place fresh food and water in enclosure
  - c. See Reptile Care Chart for appropriate diet, water source, and calcium source
- 5. Fill out the Reptile Maintenance Chart located in the Animal Care SOP binder

#### **Monthly Deep Cleaning:**

- 1. Remove pet from enclosure and place in a secure temporary enclosure
- 2. Remove All enclosure furniture, substrate, and food/water bowls
  - a. Clean enclosure furniture and food/water bowls with Dawn and water
  - b. Soak clean furniture and dishes in a 1:10 (1C per 10 gallons of water) bleach solution or spray down with 8oz per gallon Rescue and let items sit for 10 minutes
  - c. Rinse all items thoroughly and allow to air dry
- 3. Remove all organic matter (sheds, feces, urates, etc.) from enclosure using Rescue
- 4. Spray down enclosure using 8oz per gallon Rescue, let the Rescue sit wet for 10 mins, rinse thoroughly. Allow enclosure to air dry.
- 5. Once enclosure is dry place new substrate, clean furniture, and fresh food and water
- 6. Place snake back in enclosure

# Lighting:

- 1. A blue or red light bulb should be left on overnight so that temperatures do not drop below 72°
- 2. NO UVB is needed for Ball Pythons or Boa constrictors
